Spring Cleaning Time

Yea, it's still a little too cold to spend some quality time with you machine in the air, but it's the perfect time to go over it with a fine tooth comb.

Look for any signs of rust or deterioration in the metal and welds. Look for cracks or deformations in the structure. Go over the wings and tail and look for rips, tears, cracks or bumps.

Inspect your hardware. Nylock nuts that have been taken off and put back on start to loose there holding strength. Think about replacing a few if the look worn. Do you have cotter pins everywhere you should. Any broken safety wire. You do use safety wire, correct?

When was the last time you replaced your fuel line? What does the pulse line for the fuel pump look like? Maybe rebuild your fuel pump. How about your fuel tank? Any debris in the bottom?

Did you do any repairs or upgrades over the winter? Might be a good idea to review your work to insure nothing was overlooked or invite a friend to review it. Two sets of eyes are better then one, and it gives you an excuse to share a cup of coffee.

Go on out to the field and start to look over everything now, before you start to get that urge to get into the air. If you do find something major. You will have some time to correct it before you lose a nice day to fly.
