Trip Memoirs – Don James/Jonathan Gamble

May 22, 2004

Gary Amen, Mike Baker, Jonathan Gamble, and Don James originally planned to attend a breakfast at Zelienople, Pa. with a stop at Elser. An early morning rain caused us to delay our departure for an hour, and then we flew toward Elser with a very low ceiling. We were forced to fly as low as 300 AGL in places, but only made it to within 2 miles of Elser when everything looked too dense for safe navigation. Luckily we all had radios, and we elected to backtrack to Tri-City for breakfast there. At Tri-City we met Forrest Barber, the only other pilot out in the soup, and he also had given up on going to Zelienople. After breakfast, Jonathan headed north to visit Bob Showalter. Mike and Gary said they would like to see Showalter's strip, so we diverted there too. Jonathan had landed on Showalter's strip, but cautioned us on the radio not to attempt a landing as the field was VERY soft and muddy. The three of us made a few passes and then headed back to Mayfield as Jonathan attempted to take off. The last radio transmission we had from him said he was stuck and couldn't get enough speed to get into the air. Later we learned that after 4 mudslinging tries, he gave up. Bob Showalter helped bend some trees back so that Jonathan could get his Quicksilver to the road. This was a narrow road with no traffic, but electric wires were on the right and telephone lines on the left which required precision control over the craft, but he made it. Nothing like seeing a muddy brown Quick getting above those wires. Free at last! (Anyone with tips on cleaning mud from a radio, contact Jonathan). After refueling at Mayfield, Mike, Gary and Don flew to Wadsworth where they did some hanger inspections, then headed south in much improved weather, to Duane Zollinger's nice little strip near Rittman. A very pleasant and sunny flight back to Mayfield completed the day, and nobody was sad about not making it to Zelienople.

Jonathan adds, "I would say that our attempt to go to Zelienople might have been good as an experience but definitely not a good practice. Bennie and I were down and cleaned on the plane for a couple hours (sure miss the running water) and we are Not Done Yet. I have decided to get a Slip Indicator for the plane, could have used it on that trip!"
